Here's what we have been doing in 2nd Grade!

Language Arts

I am so proud of the work the students did on their book trailers! They are proud of them, too. We have started our fourth reading unit and we are reading a realistic fiction book about the massive earthquake that happened in San Francisco, CA in 1906. This story takes a look at how two different families dealt with the devastation of this horrible earthquake. We are reading from the perspective of an Chinese immigrant family and the American family they serve.

Science

We are now learning about the ocean in science. Did you know that over 70% of the earth is covered by ocean waters and that there are 5 recognized oceans? Today in science we made a carrot float! The students first may a guess as to whether they thought the carrot would float in freshwater or saltwater. Then we tired it both ways. Ask your child which type of water the carrot floated in!

Math

We began learning about subtraction with regrouping, you may remember it as borrowing. We have a poem that we use to help us remember when to regroup:

More on the top, no need to stop.

More on the floor, go next door and take 10 more.

Number's the same, zero's the game.

You can use this poem to help your child if they get stuck on their subtraction problems.

History

We are almost done with our Geography of the Americas Unit. We have been learning a little about maps. Over the next few weeks we will spend a lot of time developing and practicing our map skills. We will begin by reading the book Me on the Map by Joan Sweeney. We will do a fun project in connection with this book.
